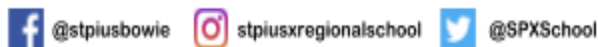

NEWS FROM THE FINANCE OFFICE



Tuition and ESP payments must be paid on or before the due date each month. Failure to do so will result in withholding a student's progress report, report card, academic record, yearbook, etc. If your tuition and/or ESP account becomes overdue by 30 days, your child(ren) may not attend school until it is paid in cash or certified funds in the school office. If payment is made directly online to TADS, it must be paid 7 days prior to this 30-day deadline, so that the funds have time to clear the bank.

There is no need to call us to confirm the status of your account; we see the same information as you on TADS. If your TADS account shows the payment was made and nothing is past due, then you are in good standing.

Thank you to the many families who do pay their tuition on time each month! We truly appreciate it! As a token of our appreciation, a prize will be awarded to one family at the end of the year from all who have kept their tuition current every month all year! VFW Youth Scholarship Programs



The 2020-21 theme is: What is Patriotism to Me?

The VFW is dedicated to promoting patriotism and investing in our future generation. If you are a patriotic middle school student interested in winning \$5,000, these scholarships may be for you.

Patriot's Pen: Each year more than 138,000 (public, private or parochial or home-study) students in grades 6-8 enter the VFW's Patriot's Pen youth essay contest for a chance to win their share of more than \$900,000 in state and national awards. Each first-place state winner receives a minimum of \$500 at the national level, and the national first place winner wins \$5,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C.

The essay contest encourages young minds to examine America's history, along with their own experiences in modern American society, by drafting a 300- to 400-word essay, expressing their views based on a patriotic theme chosen by the VFW Commander-in-Chief. All student entries must be submitted to a sponsoring local VFW Post by *midnight, October 31, 2020*.

Each year, a certified/licensed elementary, middle school and high school teacher whose curriculum focuses on citizenship education topics can be nominated for the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award.

Winners receive:

- A \$1,000 award for professional development expenses.

- A \$1,000 award for his/her school.
- Two award plaques: one for the teacher, the other for his/her school.

VFW Sponsored Programs: Buddy Poppy and Loyalty Day

Interested students who want to show their patriotism and earn scholarship money, please see information below.

Requirements: Participants must be less than 18 years old on 15 January 2021. Participants will answer questions before a panel.

Buddy Poppy Program: Participants will answer 12 questions associated with the VFW Buddy Poppy Program.

Loyalty Day Program: Participants will answer 11 questions associated with Loyalty Day and the American Flag.

For those that are unfamiliar with the Buddy Poppy or Loyalty Day:

Buddy Poppy: Since 1922, the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) has distributed Buddy Poppies to “Honor the Dead by Helping the Living.” Proceeds from Buddy Poppy donations are used to assist the Veterans of Foreign Wars National Home in Eaton Rapids, Michigan, the National VFW Rehabilitation Services in Washington, D.C., the Rehabilitation Services in Maryland, and to provide direct assistance to the needy and disabled veterans and their families within our communities.

Loyalty Day is observed annually on May 1st. In the United States, National Loyalty Day is a special holiday meant for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States of America, and for the recognition of the heritage of American freedom. Loyalty Day was made an official reoccurring holiday on July 18, 1958. The purpose is to counteract Communism and the radical elements in our society, and to promote loyalty to our country and respect for our flag.

household products and redeem them for cash. Simply check the items you buy at the grocery store/ Target/Wal-Mart for Box Tops for Education labels. You will find the labels on dozens of different types of products like: food/drink, paper products, office supplies, cleaning supplies, food storage, tableware and many more. Once purchased, please cut the labels off and return them to school. Don't forget to check the expiration date, as we cannot get credit for expired labels. We will earn 10¢ for every label. St. Pius X can also earn cash

from Bonus Certificates, which can be found primarily in stores on specially marked packages and at checkout printed on a receipt. These vary on value based on the promotion. Bonus codes begin with the letter A. Also look for eBox Tops Codes, which are a 16 digit eBoxTops code that is printed on the product. You would be surprised at how many products you buy every day carry a Box Tops for Education label.



HARRIS TEETER 'S TOGETHER IN EDUCATION PROGRAM: This program translates your spending at Harris Teeter to rewards for SPX. We need YOU to register and it's easy and it's FREE. Simply give the cashier our code, 4154, and your VIC card when you check out and your card will be linked for the entire school year. That's it! You only have to link your VIC card once each school year. Once your card is linked, St. Pius X Regional School will receive a percentage of your Harris Teeter brand (Harris Teeter, H.T. Traders, Harris Teeter Organics, HT Farmers Market and purchases in the HT Pharmacy) purchases credited back to our account. This program does not interfere with your VIC savings or cost you any money! Don't forget to link your VIC card to our account code next time you are shopping at Harris Teeter.
