*FINANCIAL AID FOR 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR * APPLICATIONS DUE SATURDAY, DECEMBER 1ST

The Archdiocese of Washington works hard to keep Catholic education as affordable as possible. The Archdiocesan Tuition Assistance Program is available for students in grades PreK-12 who are applying to or currently enrolled in Catholic Schools within the Archdiocese of Washington (Washington, DC and Calvert, Charles, St. Mary's, Montgomery and Prince George's counties in Maryland).

All tuition assistance obtained through the archdiocese is based on financial need. Families must apply each year to receive assistance and need must be demonstrated each year to qualify. Applying for tuition aid has no bearing on whether a student is admitted to a school.

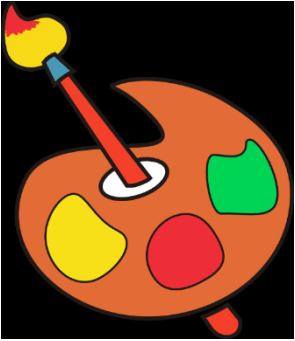

Catholic High School Scholarship Information

Knights of Columbus Scholarship Program

The Maryland State Council of the Knights of Columbus in partnership with the Knights of Columbus Insurance Advisors is the sponsor of several High School Scholarships for its members and for Catholic students in general. Below is a brief summary of these scholarships and information regarding eligibility for scholarship awards.

The Frederick M. Gossman Memorial High School Scholarship

Designed to assist those Brother Knights holding membership in councils within the jurisdiction of Maryland in paying tuition for their sons and daughters at accredited Catholic High Schools; three grants of \$ 1 , 5 0 0 . 0 0 per year, for up to four years, will be awarded. Awards will be made on the basis of academic excellence, personal qualifications, and financial need. The children of deceased members are also eligible, provided the member was in good standing at the time of death.

Catholic High School Scholarship Information cont'd

The William J. O'Brien Jr., Memorial Catholic High School Scholarship

Three grants of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years will be awarded. This program is open to any Catholic student who is a resident of the State of Maryland to include children and grandchildren of a member of a Knights of Columbus council within the jurisdiction of Maryland. Applicants must have been officially accepted at or must be students at accredited Catholic High Schools. Applications will be judged on academic excellence, personal qualifications, and financial need.

Application period is from October 1, 2018 to February 1, 2019. All applications must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than February 1, 2019.

A NOTE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE – TIS THE SEASON FOR COLD AND FLU



▪ **Do not send a student with a fever to school, and do not return them to school until fever-free for 24 hours without any medicine help** (fever-reducing medicines include acetaminophen [Tylenol], aspirin [Bayer], ibuprofen [Advil or Motrin], or combination products like Pediacare, Dayquil, Triaminic, Theraflu, etc). And please, *do not* give fever medicine and then send student to school; it will wear off in 4 hours and you will have to come take your child back home anyway. Fever medicines mask illness symptoms--your child can still be contagious, passing illness along to others at school.

- ***NOTE:** A normal core body temperature is 97-99°F (36.1-37.2°C), most accurately measured rectally or tympanically (ear canal). Oral and forehead temps are *not* reliable; we measure tympanically at school. Health Dept. and School policies require a student to be sent home if 100°F (37.8°C) or higher. Although 99-100° (37.2-37.6°C) can feel uncomfortable & make the forehead feel “warm,” these are 'low-grade' temperatures, often due to non-illness, benign, or temporary causes, like under-hydration, intense concentration/stress, vigorous exercise/play, seasonal allergies/pollen, hot/humid weather, immunization reactions, etc. Fever of 102°F (38.9°C) or higher requires medical attention for possible bacterial or viral illness, heat stroke, severe injury/trauma, etc; some medicines and diseases can also induce high fevers. (*see school website Health Topics for more info*)
- **Repeated vomiting and/or diarrhea at any time indicates illness or infection; keep child home for at least 24hours AFTER the last episode** to allow for adequate rest & recovery, and to reduce spread of illness at school; call your Physician/Licensed Provider if illness symptoms persist.

A NOTE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE – TIS THE SEASON FOR COLD AND FLU cont'd

- **A student diagnosed with Communicable disease and/or who misses 3 or more days of school due to illness or injury, must submit a Physician/Licensed Provider's Back-to-School clearance to RN *before returning to class.*** Included diagnoses: Pink eye, Flu, Pneumonia, Strep throat, Ringworm, Impetigo, Measles, Chicken Pox, Whooping Cough/Pertussis, Tuberculosis/TB, Meningitis, Hepatitis, HIV/AIDS; complications of *or* prolonged Asthma, Diabetes, or Seizures; severe trauma/injury and/or surgery. Contact RN for accountability details & Back-to-School Clearance requirements.
- **Keep child home for *at least 24 hours* after the first dose of any prescribed antibiotic.** Student may return thereafter, provided any remaining symptoms will be manageable at school.
- **A student with open skin lesions may not be at school until *AFTER* examined by a Physician/Licensed Provider *and* a Back-to-School Clearance note/proof of treatment is submitted to RN.** Before student returns to class, all exposed lesions must be completely covered by Band-Aids or appropriate/approved head cover. (*see school website Health Topics for more info*)
- **Parent will be called if student has Lice/Pediculosis; student does not have to leave school until the end of the day, but proof of approved Home or Professional treatment and re-check by RN is required before student may return to class.** A second treatment in 7-10 days is strongly recommended. (*see school website Health Topics for more info*)
- **When student needs to go home, please arrange for prompt pick up within 30-60 minutes.** Student will rest & wait in HR. You must sign student out from school at the Front Reception desk; for everyone's safety, we cannot release a student to anyone not authorized to pick up (*must be listed with us as a Primary or Secondary Emergency Contact*)

NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD

CURRENT/UPCOMING VACANCIES ON THE SCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD



Several seats will be available on the SAB at the end of this school year for qualified school parents/guardians who, if selected, would be able and willing to volunteer substantial time to support our school and the administration.

The reasons that the SAB will entertain so many upcoming vacancies at one time are that either member terms are ending, or the family is “graduating” from SPX School.

Current Open Seat Available right now:

**One (1) seat—St. Pius Parish

Upcoming Seats that will be available effective June 1, 2019:

***Two (2) seats—**St. Edward’s Parish**, South Bowie

***One (1) seat—**Ascension Parish**, Old Bowie

***One (1) seat—**St. Pius X Parish**, Bowie (note—there will be two (2) open seats as of June 2019 for SPX Parish if the current open seat is not filled prior to June 2019).

***One (1) **At-Large seat**—This seat has traditionally been held by a non-Catholic parent, although all interested school parents/guardians may apply.

If selected for an upcoming vacancy, successful candidates may be asked to attend regular board meetings this spring. Please note that five of the six seats require the applicant to be an active member of that parish. The at-large seat may be filled by either a Catholic OR non-Catholic school parent/guardian. If multiple parents/guardians apply for one seat, the Board reserves the right to schedule interviews of potential qualified candidates.

11/13/18 Parent Administration Forum Summary (grades PK, K, and 1)

Several issues were discussed at the 11/13/18 Parent Administration Forum including:

**the outdoor morning drop off is safe. Staff are outside to watch the cars and students; the dropoff time gives students a chance to socialize prior to the start of school. Mrs. Schrom enjoys a close working relationship with the City and County police departments;

**the difference between a lead teacher and the small group teacher;

**mandatory VIRTUS (child protection) training for parents who volunteer directly with students at the school;

**sports for younger students: the CYO program is run through SPX Parish, not the school. Programs for younger children have different rules and require lots of parent involvement;

**the school cannot use Nelson Hall as a cafeteria. SPX School hosts three lunch periods each school day and usage of Nelson Hall as a cafeteria would not be feasible at this time;

**Report cards: Mrs. Graham (third grade teacher) provided a detailed explanation of report card standards, specifically the difference between “EE” (exceeding expectations) and “ME” (meets expectations) on first quarter report cards. Students may earn “EE” ratings later in the school year but only if certain enumerated criteria are met. Teachers want to see continuous improvement throughout the school year. The school will send home further explanation of what the report card standards mean to parents of younger students in the near future;

**a parent requested that the Newsnotes calendar list which grades will attend the school masses;

**standardized tests: mandatory math IXL is assigned over the summer so that our math scores remain at a high level. Teachers want to see improvements in a students standardized test scores as the school year progresses.

**Blue ribbon: SPX School cannot reapply for the National Blue Ribbon Award until 2021.
